




We are happy to announce that that we have teamed up with Asaya Hotel Kota Kinabalu for Race Pack collection on 12th and 13th September.

Course checking and preparations are progressing well – below are a few pictures along the course.












The course maintains all the (in)famous signature trails of the TMBT such as the Jungle Rumble between W2 and W3 with technical but beautiful trails through forest and plantations, over small hills and crossing refreshing streams; the never-ending Pineapple Ridge with spectacular views to the steep southern face of Mt. Kinabalu from W3 to W4; the brutal "double hill" of Bukit Dallas trail up to the finish line for the 30k and 50k categories; the Happy Villa view hill with spectacular views to Kinabalu on the 7.5k, 37 and 109 km trails.

We will be just past full moon for the 37k night run with a good chance of some spectacular night views to Mt. Kinabalu on a clear night.





Asia Trail Master (ATM) Championship Finals





We are excited to host the 2024 Asia Trail Master Championship's 'Season's Final' in conjunction with the TMBT.

Runners qualify for the ATM Championship Final by scoring ATM points throughout the season. Per Asian country, maximum five male and five female runners - the highest point scorers - will receive invitation to join the final race. A minimum of 2 ATM race finishes is required for everyone. The ATM Championship Final race will be held on a specifically designed course that includes some of the best and most scenic parts of the TMBT 110k course with a new trail section to shorten the full course.

The (in)famous Pineapple Ridge is of course also included. The total race distance will measure around 78 km and the total elevation gain is estimated at over 4500 hm, which is significant. There are some technical jungle trail sections, but most is quite runable, so the main obstacle for many participants will likely be the heat and humidity of the region. The race will start in Lingkubang at 5 am, roughly one hour before sunrise. The finish line is at the Perkasa Hotel in Kundasang together with the finish for the traditional 100, 37 and 7.5 km routes.



1)All measurements above subject to +/-0.5 tolerance.

2)Tapered curve bottom at the back specially designed for athlletic movements, enhancing fle-xibility and performance.

3)Half chest to be measured from left to right seam,1" down from the armpit joint.

4)Half waist to be measured from left to right seam on the waist line.

5) Shirt length to be measured from the highest tip of the shoulder to the bottom $\mbox{hem}.$

Borneo Ultra Trail Marathon (BUTM) 2024



BUTM falls during the dry season in Sabah and has often been known to be hot – and 2024 was no exception. The morning of race day started with cloud cover that kept the temperatures down for the first half of the day, further aided by a brief rain-shower on the exposed Talantang Loop of the 50 and 100 km routes. This led to good conditions for the top runners. Sunday morning was a different story with clear skies and temperatures were soon soaring, adding an extra challenge for those still on the 100 km course as well as the 9 km course.

Several of the "usual" top runners in the 100 km had chosen to run the 50 km instead, leaving the door open to veteran runner Gustin Tiam who took an impressive win ahead of his much younger competitors with Mohd Sulhan in second and Oswald Maikol in third. In the women's category, Rejlen James took the honors ahead of Adelinah Lintanga and Lynda Marylyn. In the 50 km race, Alessandro Sherpa threw in a strong challenge in the start and was leading up to halfway, but the usual 100 km runners of Milton Amat and Wilsen Singgin took charge on the Talantang Loop with Milton taking the win ahead of Wilsen and then Alessandro. In the women's category, young and rising star Shamiera Auther led from start to finish, while veteran runner Kona Liau overtook Vicki Yuxuan Zhu of Singapore to take second place with Vicki having to settle for third.
